

SPANISH TRANSFER PATHWAY ASSOCIATE DEGREE (AA) **FALL 2024**

ST. CLOUD TECHNICAL & COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This degree offers students an opportunity to complete an associate degree that fully transfers to a Spanish bachelor's degree program at any of five universities within the Minnesota State system that offers this major. These include Bemidji State University, MN State University, Mankato & Moorhead campuses, St. Cloud State University, Winona State University.

Program Goals /Outcomes

- 1. Compare the target cultures and their own culture on topics relating to culture, food, art, history, music, religion, and society.
- 2. Discuss and analyze contributions by Latinx and Latin American artists, activists, musicians, and authors.
- 3. Expand the use of Spanish beyond the school setting for life-long learning and participating in a global community.
- 4. Infer and explain social, cultural and political issues reflected in literary works from Spanish-speaking countries.
- 5. Examine historical figures from the Spanish-speaking world within their social and historical background.
- 6. Explore Latinx Literature and Latin American Studies to further deepen their knowledge of the language, culture, and history of the Spanish-speaking population here in the U.S. and abroad.

Developmental Courses

Some courses may require appropriate test scores or may need preparatory courses in the areas of English, mathematics, or reading. Courses numbered below 1000 will not apply toward this degree.

Notes

Students who have been placed by faculty into an upper-level SPAN course, will select elective credits to ensure completion of 60 credits to earn the degree.
