Dental Assistant Program Description

The Dental Assistant is a full-time program that begins each fall semester.

- 30 students are accepted each fall semester
- Program begins each fall semester
- 4 semesters: fall, spring, fall, spring

It is a competitive program that requires a thorough application process

Dental assistants are important members of the dental healthcare team, and a degree from SCTCC will prepare graduates with the skills needed to have a career in the dental profession.

Students will learn and develop skills in chairside assisting, infection control procedures, instrument and materials usage, laboratory procedures, administrative duties, mechanical polishing, sealant application, and other expanded functions.

Graduates of the program find work in dental offices in a variety of settings. As a dental assistant you may work side by side with the dentist or as office personnel scheduling appointments or billing. Dental assistants work in corporate or private practices, in dental product sales, or as OSHA compliance officer.

Dental Assistant Careers

Graduates of the program find work in dentists' offices, as well as work as a dental office manager, in public and private practices, in dental product sales, or as OSHA compliance officer.

- The 3-year placement rate for the Dental Assistant program is 100%.
- The average Central MN hourly salary range is \$23.50 per hour.

Prospective/Returning Student - Application Process

- Your first step is to apply to SCTCC as a Pre-Dental Asst student at https://sctcc.edu/apply
- Follow instructions received by Admissions and Records & Registration offices.
- Meet with an advisor to begin the *Current SCTCC Student* process.

Current SCTCC Student / Advisor Meetings - Academic Advising Center

- Current SCTCC students are required to meet with an advisor at least once a semester to receive a registration access code and review their academic plan.
- We encourage students to visit more often with any questions or concerns they may have.
- We are here to align you with resources that are available and help guide you through your educational journey at SCTCC!



Dental Assistant Planner (AAS/Diploma)

- A minimum grade of "C" or better AND a cumulative GPA of <u>2.5</u> or above in pre-requisite coursework is required to be considered for admission.
- Students can apply with pre-requisites in-progress, MUST be complete prior to the start of the program. Priority will be given to students with all pre-requisites complete at the time of application.
- When applying to the program, applicants must be in *Good Academic Standing* at SCTCC
 Not on warning or probation cumulative GPA 2.0 & cumulative completion rate of 66.67%.
- **<u>RE-TAKE Options</u>**: Each pre-requisite and General Education course may be taken 3 times.
 - Consult with an advisor about the impact of repeated courses.
- Program application dates and periods may vary and/or be extended. Priority is given to those who apply during the first application period. Stay up to date by checking the program page frequently.
- The Dental Assistant program is competitive, the college may not be able to accept all applicants that meet the minimum admission standards.

- (During Dental Assistant orientation meeting)

NOT Required, but recommended to improve program acceptance:

- Complete Nurse Assistance course
 - HLTH 1402 or HCCC 1415 & HCCC 1425 or provide 75-hour certificate
- Complete 9 or more college credits (at any institution)

Application Timeline for the Dental Assistant Program at SCTCC

- Must be a current SCTCC student to apply to the program
 - The Dental Assistant application is open December 1st through March 1st
 - Dates are estimated and subject to change. Review Dental Assisting page for updates.
- Application is found at https://www.sctcc.edu/dental-assistant-apply-online
- 6 weeks after application period closes:
 - Accepted applicants will have letters sent
 - Top 30 ranking students
 - o <u>Alternate List</u> applicants will be notified of their status
 - **<u>Non-accepted</u>** applicants are notified & encouraged to meet with an advisor to discuss:
 - ways to improve your application before reapplying to the program
 - your educational options / course selection for next semester
 - other programs and opportunities at SCTCC

Students admitted to the Dental Assistant program

- Applicants will be notified of the date and time for the mandatory Dental Assistant student orientation, usually held in May.
- Applicants MUST supply documentation of current AHA/Basic Life Support.
- Applicants will be required to take and pass a MN Criminal Background study, electronic fingerprinting, AND drug testing (paid for by the student).

Students placed on the Alternate List for Dental Assistant

- Applicants who meet the requirements but were not admitted because the
- program was full will be placed on a ranked alternate list.
- Applicants placed on this list will be eligible for admission to the program if spaces open prior to the beginning of the fall semester.
- ALL applicants who wish to gain admission to the Dental Assistant Program in the future must reapply, including those who were on the previous year's alternate list.

***If an applicant is accepted and declines to be admitted into the program, no preference will be given to the applicant should he or she choose to apply in any subsequent year. In order to be considered for admission in any subsequent year, such students will need to go through the entire application process again.

Program FAQ's – Dental Assistant Program

Can I apply directly to the Dental Assistant program? Students MUST be a *Current Student* (applied and accepted to SCTCC). Can I apply to the program without all of the pre-requisites complete?

Students can apply with pre-requisites in-progress, MUST be complete prior to the start of the program. Priority will be given to students with all pre-requisites complete at the time of application.

Can I re-take a pre-requisite course to improve my GPA?

Each pre-requisite and General Education course may be taken 3 times. Consult with an advisor about the impact of

repeated courses.

When does the Dental Assistant program start?

The Dental Assistant program is a 4-semester program that begins each Fall Semester.

How many students are accepted?

30 students are accepted each fall semester.

Can I attend Part-Time?

The Dental Assistant program is a *full-time* program only.

When can I apply to the program?

The Dental Assistant application window is open December 1st through March 1st and can be found at <u>http://www.sctcc.edu/dental-assistant-apply-online</u>

Once accepted to the program, what is the schedule like?

First year classes (semester 1 - fall semester)

Monday: lecture from 10am-3pm, lab from 4-6 p.m. Wednesday: 1-4p.m. Friday: 10am-11am

(No classes held on Tuesday and Thursday the first semester).

First year classes (semester 2 - spring semester)

Monday: lecture from 11am-3pm and Tuesday: lecture from 1pm-3pm

Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday lab from 8am-Noon,

Friday lab either 8am-10am, 10am-Noon or Noon-2pm

Second year classes (semester 3 - fall semester)

Monday: lecture 10am-Noon, Tuesday: lecture 1pm-2pm, Wednesday: lecture 1pm-2pm Tuesday, Wednesday,

Thursday lab from 8am-Noon (No class on Friday)

Second year classes (semester 4 – spring semester)

First Month some class time, remaining of the semester students will be completing internship.

Is the Dental Assistant program accredited?

St. Cloud Technical and Community College dental assistant program is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association. Graduates will be eligible to write the Dental Assisting National Board Certification examination as well as the Minnesota licensure examination. Statistically over the past several years, SCTCC dental assistant students have scored **above the national and state average on both of these exams.** Students earn the credentials CDA (Certified Dental Assistant) and LDA (Licensed dental Assistant) after successful completion of these exams.
